

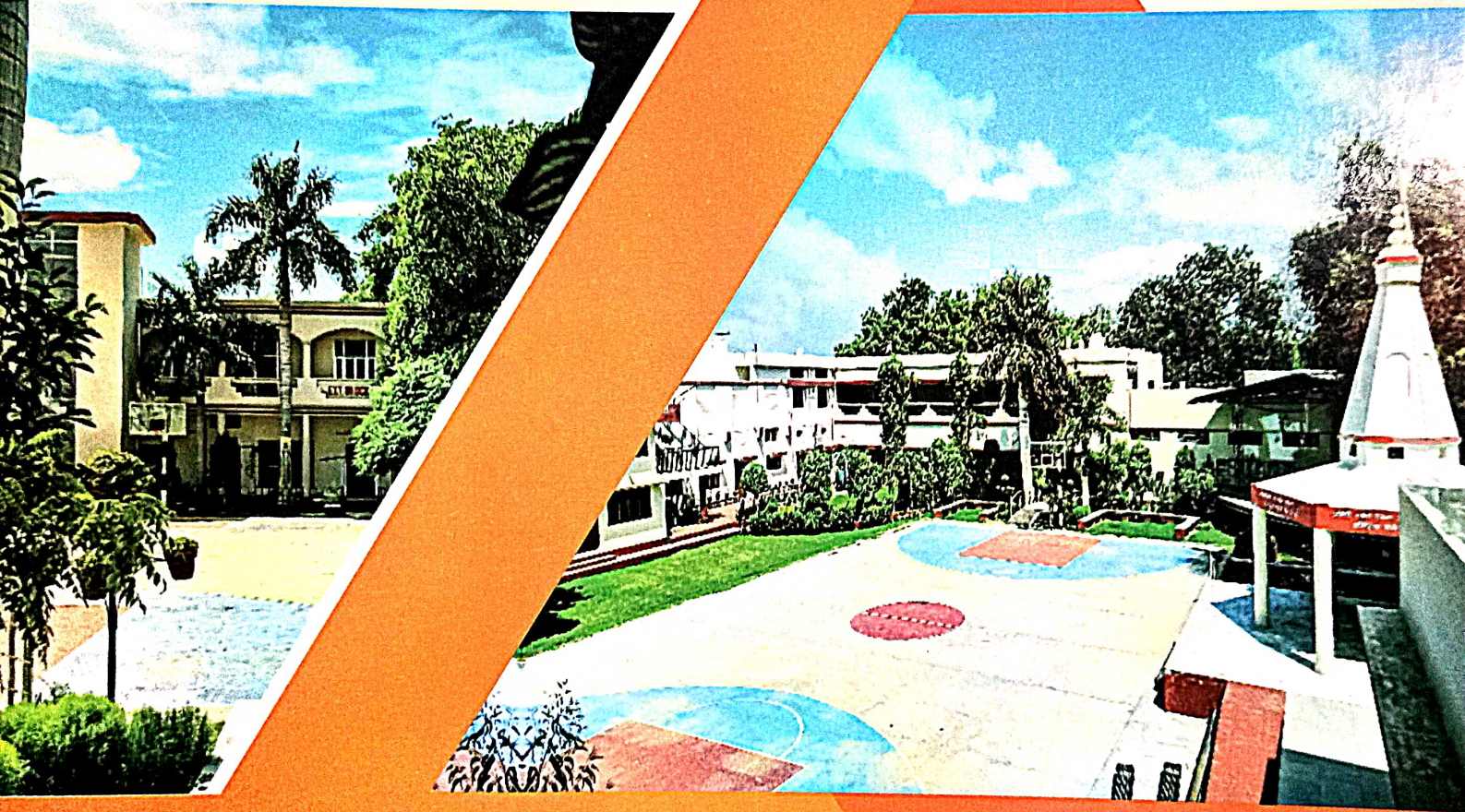

CONTINUANCE OF TRAINING

- ◆ The M.Ed.B/.Ed. course commences in the month of October/November and extends over two full academic years having four semesters, which can be completed in maximum of three years from the date of admission to the programme.
- ◆ No concession shall be given because of medical or any other leave (Except Remission of Fine)
- ◆ Bus passes of these students will not be recommended for renewal who fall short of minimum attendance criteria.

MODE OF ADMISSION

Admission to B.Ed. Course (250 seats) over a span of two years (4 semester) will be done on the basis of entrance test to be conducted by Panjabi University, Patiala as per NCTE, Punjab Govt. rules. The reservation will be as per rules.

Admission to M.Ed. Course (50 seats) with a duration of two years (4 semesters) will be on the merit basis as per NCTE and Panjab University, Chandigarh norms by the College for the session 2021-23.

Admission to D.El.Ed. Course (50 seats) will be done on merit basis as per NCTE and SCERT Mohali admission norms.

ADMISSION PROCESS

- ◆ The application for admission to M.Ed., B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. courses can be made through the prescribed form attached herewith this prospectus.
- ◆ No reason may be assigned for not selecting a candidate for admission.
- ◆ While admitting candidate from the category of handicapped persons, the selection committee shall decide that only such candidates are selected those who can teach a class. A certificate to this effect is required from civil surgeon. Blind candidates are not allowed to take admission to M.Ed., B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. courses.
- ◆ Selected candidates of other Universities are required to submit their Inter University migration certificate before the due date prescribed by the university. In the case of non submission of migration certificate, admission will be provisional and at the risk and responsibility of the candidate.
- ◆ The Conditions stated in the prospectus may be modified without notice under instructions from NCTE, P.U. Chandigarh, Punjab Govt. or any other competent authority.
- ◆ Reservation will be as per rules and regulations.

ATTENDANCE RULES

Minimum attendance of student teachers shall be 80% for all course work and practicum and 90% for school internship. The students falling short of lectures will not be allowed to take part in university semester examinations.

EXAMINATION-QUALIFYING RULES

Minimum pass marks are 40% in each paper, practical and school internship in each semester. However, the promotion from semester I to II and from III to IV shall be as per Panjab University policy for semester courses. Pass marks will be 40% in aggregate.

DISCIPLINE - NORMS

- ◆ During the period of training, the student must not Indulge in any anti-government/ anti-college activities. Extreme penalty for such activities may include expulsion from the college and forfeiture of character certificate.
- ◆ M.Ed., B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. are full time courses and if any candidate doing M.Ed./ B.Ed/ D.El.Ed. course is found to have been on active service during the period of training, his admission will be cancelled.



- ◆ At any time during the course of training, the Principal on the advice of staff, may drop a student from the rolls of college or debar him/her from participation in activities. (If found violating the college norms)
- ◆ Testimonials or character certificates are issued to students ordinarily on the completion of their training course after due enquiry from their teachers/tutors and after consulting their college record.
- ◆ Certificate may be withheld in case of misconduct, irregular attendance and dissatisfactory progress in study or non-payment of dues.
- ◆ On Thursday, every pupil teacher will come in college uniform. Boys shall wear White Pants & White Shirts as uniform. Colour of Turban (if any) will be saffron. Similarly, girls will wear White Suits and Saffron Dupatta.
- ◆ Students are advised to make it a habit to see college notice board thrice a day i.e. morning, in recess and before leaving the college.

ANTIRAGGING AUTHORIZATION

“As per orders of honorable Supreme Court of India ref. No. SLP @ No. 24295/2004, any student involved in ‘RAGGING’ may be expelled from the institution”.

LEAVE RULES

- ◆ The college expects all its pupil teachers to be very regular in studies. Leave application is required to be sanctioned in advance by the Sadan In-charge for a maximum duration of three days. If leave of more than three days is required by the student in an emergency, the student is required to take sanction of College Principal.
- ◆ If a student remains absent from his/her classes for a continuous period of seven days without leave, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls. He/She may be allowed re-admission in accordance with the rules.

REFUND OF SECURITIES

The security will be refunded after the student has left the hostel and the college within one year only.

- ◆ Securities that remain unclaimed for one year after a student has left the college or hostel will lapse to the college. It shall be used for rooms, furniture and repairs. No claim for refunds will be entertained after that period.
- ◆ **D.M.C.s:** After the result of M.Ed., B.Ed., and D.El.Ed. Detail Marks Card is to be issued only to candidates. The D.M.C. will not be handed over to the relatives. However, in exceptional circumstances, the students must send request-cum-authority letter attesting the signature of the bearer if some other person is sent to collect D.M.C. on his/her behalf.

Most of the faculty members are doctorate in the field of education and many others are pursuing their doctorate. Faculty of the college is often invited as resource persons in various workshops and seminars held at National and Inter-National level.

FACULTY ENRICHMENT PROGRAMMES

Faculty Enrichment Programmes are organised regularly to help our faculty members to penetrate into recent trends and practices in educational arena. Eminent professionals and experts are invited to train our professorates in innovative teaching and learning methods, Research, student Psychology and other life skills like stress management, time management etc. to lead a successful career in their respective fields.



LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRES

SWAMI DAYANAND STUDY CENTRE

Swami Dayanand study centre under the Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India Scheme from UGC undertakes research and disseminates Swami Ji's ideology. It has unique and wide compendium of books in the library. The centre aims at exposing the prospective teachers to the teachings of the paragon. The study centre also releases the published anthology of papers presented by scholars during seminars and panel discussions for the moral development of the students.

ICT RESOURCE CENTRE

The college provides first hand experiences of latest technological devices such as interactive board, Wi-Fi, LCD projectors, Scanner, Printer, Internet & Overhead Projector to its pupil teachers. The main focus of the institute is to provide contemporary technological orientation to its pupil teachers.



MATHEMATICS RESOURCE CENTRE

Mathematics resource centre is equipped with various charts, models, CD's, books, lesson plans and relevant instructional material. The available resource material enhances the capability of prospective teachers to think, reason and solve problems by making use of various teaching aids.



SOCIAL SCIENCE RESOURCE CENTRE

With an objective to impart among pupil teachers the interdisciplinary knowledge of social sciences, the Social Sciences Resource centre is well equipped with physical, political geographical, national and world maps, Globes, 3D flash cards and scrap books. The display of relevant material and apparatuses makes the teaching lively and interesting.

COMPUTER LAB

Fully networked, Air conditioned hi-tech computer lab is well equipped with 32 computers, Wi-Fi, Printer, Scanner, LCD projectors and all modern electronic gadgets to make students tech-savvy. The prospective teachers are trained to use multi-media presentations and effectual use of laboratory is done by M.Ed. students for research work. Learning management system (LMS) training is imparted to faculty members time to time specially for online teaching.



LANGUAGE-CUM-TEACHING LAB

To develop skill-in-teaching with good communication, the language cum-Teaching-Lab of the college is class-room designed and arranged to make language learning more effective. The lab can accommodate 40 students at time. Lab has all technical assistance, digital conferencing controlled by Master control panel, audio-visual Aids and projectors attached with computers. All four skills of language (LSRW) are taken care of in language laboratory.



PSYCHOLOGY AND GUIDANCE LAB

The college has a psychology and guidance lab equipped with various guidance tests, psychological tests and relevant equipments. The B.Ed./M.Ed. students, research scholars and faculty members make use of these tests for conducting research.



HOME SCIENCE LAB

The institute has Home Science lab well equipped with modern facilities where the pupil teachers are given practical training in foods and nutrition, clothing and textiles, home management, flower arrangement and Alpana etc.



SCIENCE LAB

College has well maintained teaching learning resource lab for science subject with multiple sets of science apparatus and testing material for practical work and experiments.

CAREER AND COUNSELLING PORTAL

The Cell conducts orientation programmes and arranges expert lectures for career counselling. The cell also undertakes personality development programmes to help sharpen the interview skills of the students by organising mock interviews by the experts, thereby enhance the employability of the students.

ART AND CRAFT ROOM

To foster creativity among students, the college has well equipped art room for artistic acumen of the students. The pupil teachers are given plenty of opportunities to gratify their creative urge and brush up their skills through various artistic activities.

PLACEMENT CELL

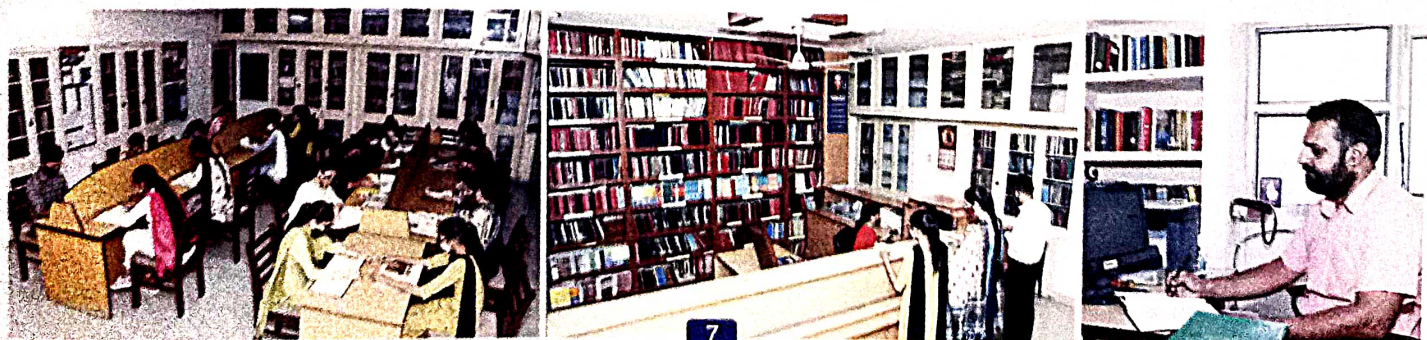
Employability is a yardstick for evaluating the quality of any professional institution. The placement cell of the college conducts formal campus interviews for the budding teachers. During such interviews college students get opportunities to attend mock interviews with in campus. In addition, the cell also organizes pre-placement orientation for the students wherein they are trained for CV writing, interview skills and the selection process of institutions.

DIGITAL LIBRARY

Immense, Voluminous, and well equipped college library with inflibnet facility, AC Reading Hall, book bank and open self facility serves the students and academic staff. The library presently includes more than 27000 books, current national and international journals, references, encyclopedias, magazines, news papers and educational CD's. Computers with internet browsing facility are meant to be used by the faculty and students only for their academic, research related matters.

Students are required to abide by the following rules:

- ◆ All students are provided bar coded smart cards for library dealings.
- ◆ Books are issued for a period of fortnight (15 days) on a non-transferable Library cum Identity Card. In case of loss, A duplicate card may be obtained on payment of Rs. 150/-.
- ◆ Defaulters of returning the books with in stipulated time are liable to a fine of Rs. 1/- per day per volume.
- ◆ Reference Books and Current periodicals are not issued.



CAFETERIA



College has its own spacious canteen where separate seating space is provided to boys and girls. Tea and snacks are available in it. The students are not allowed to entertain any Guests without the prior permission of the Principal.



HOSTEL (FOR GIRLS ONLY)

A fully furnished hostel with warm ambience, home like condition and capacity to accommodate 35 girl students is available in college campus.

A resident student shall have to abide by the rules of conduct of hostellers which include:

- ◆ Strict observance of study hours.
- ◆ Only vegetarian food is allowed in the campus.
- ◆ Visit to cinema is normally not permitted. Permission is granted only with prior written permission of the hostel warden.
- ◆ Students will be responsible for any damage to allotted furniture.
- ◆ Residents shall not keep valuable items like Diamond, Gold and heavy cash in their rooms.
- ◆ Hostel dues once deposited will not be refunded

GYMNASIA

To sustain and setup a healthy fitness regime, college has a well facilitated gymnasium located on the Ground floor with modern strength training equipments and machines. Gym offers the use of our fitness facility to both students and the staff. Trained instructor is available for guidance and training.



COMMON ROOM

College has a common room with comfy chairs, indoor games and recreational facilities. The aim for setting up common room in the college is to make the students relax, refresh and utilize their leisure time Productively.



AWARDS & HONOURS FOR STUDENTS

At the end of session, prizes will be awarded to Boys and Girls separately as follows:

- (a) All Round Best student based on Academic, Sports and Community work (he/she must be among the top twenty Students) (b) Best Community worker (c) Best Captain (d) Best Sadan Secretary (e) Best Association or Club Secretary or President. (f) Best N.S.S worker (g) Best Actor (h) Best Dancer (i) Best Singer (j) Maximum Attendance (k) Best speaker in English, Hindi and Punjabi (l) Best Athlete. These prizes will be given only if suitable students are found.

SCHOLARSHIPS, STIPENDS AND FEE CONCESSION

- ◆ Various scholarships to be awarded to the students by Panjab University are means-cum merit, sports, single Girl Child, Physically disabled and Aids/Cancer Patient.
- ◆ National and State Govt. merit scholarship, scheduled caste & backward class scholarships are tenable in the college.
- ◆ Student aid fund is distributed to the needy students by student welfare committee and with the help of NGOs.
- ◆ Student will be eligible for only one scholarship/stipend at a time.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN ACTIVITIES

- ◆ The college begins everyday with morning assembly in Room no. 1 which is compulsory for all students..
- ◆ Each Sadan is on duty for a week and is responsible for making all the arrangements.
- ◆ Havan Yajana is performed in congregation of the staff members and pupil teachers on every Thursday in the Yagya Shalla of the college followed by moral discourses, Bhajans, Vedic Mantra recitation and spiritual verses from the scriptures.
- ◆ In case of a complaint of misconduct or unfair means during house test against an office bearer he/she shall be suspended from the office during the period of inquiry.
- ◆ Books reviews, Brain trust/ Academic Tournaments, Inter-Sadan Competitions Extension Lectures, Teaching Skill Competitions, Wall Magazine, Quiz Competitions, Talent Hunt, Fine Arts and Home Science competitions are some of the main activities of the college.
- ◆ School Captains (Pupil Teacher Supervisors) are nominated for each practicing school to serve as the vital links between the college & the practicing school. They assist the teacher supervisors.

BEYOND THE ACADEMICS

YOUTH SERVICE CLUB

YSC has been established to hunt the hidden talent of students in various fields. The objective of YSC is to acquaint the pupil teachers with the rich cultural diversity of India. Every year in the beginning of session, best performers are selected in Talent Hunt Competitions. College provides all facilities to nurture the talent of students and send them for Youth Festival.

Apart from this, the YSC department organizes various functions from time to time in the college for the development of the students and send teams for inter college competitions..

The Student can participate in following activities:-

- i) Fine Arts: Rangoli, Poster Making, Cartooning, Still Life & Landscape drawing, Clay Modelling, Sketching, Flower Arrangement (Fresh & Dry)
- ii) Dances: General, Folk & Classical (Individual & Group)

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

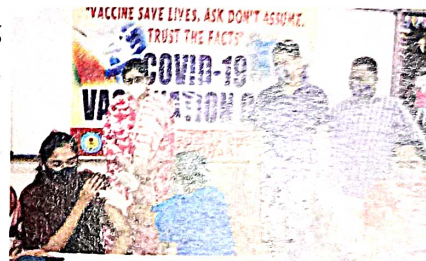
